MINUTES LBHA General Meeting May 16, 2018



ARENA:: Please NO TRAILERS or HORSES on the asphalt parking lot. ALSO, no barrels, poles or other equipment may be used in the arena. Small Orange cones are OK. Trainers must have an Arena Use form submitted annually as well as the proper insurance naming LBHA and Placer County as "Also Insureds." If Insurance is cancelled 2 times or more, the permit is no longer valid. Trainers MUST contact LBHA with the time and number of students that will be in class, 24 hrs before the lesson. (All Forms are on LBHA Website at LBHA.us)

Introduction:

Kennedy Meadow has **three** *entirely separate* components: ① Stanislaus National Forest **horse campground** and trailhead, ② Stanislaus National Forest **public campgrounds for families**, and ③ the splendid and **privately-owned** Kennedy Meadow Resort (rental summer cabins, grocery store, restaurant, saloon, *etc.*) where daily horseback rides can be rented to the public during the summer months.


This report is focused *only* on the U.S. Forest Service **horse campground**. A separate report will be written about the Kennedy Meadow Resort, which is one mile distant from the U.S.F.S. horse campground. *Please do not confuse the two sites* that are close together: one is public **federal** land within Stanislaus National Forest, and one is entirely **private and commercial**.

The U.S.F.S. horse campground and horse trailhead will be of primary interest to **Backcountry Horse-men of California** (with emphasis on packing-in trail crews for the Pacific Crest Trail); endurance riders of the **American Endurance Ride Conference** who wish to condition their horses in the Sierra Nevada Range at high altitude; and day-riders who wish to escape the summer heat of the Sacramento Valley. Kennedy Meadow horse camp is at elevation 6,330 feet and Sonora Pass is 9,624 feet. The cost for Kennedy Meadow horse camp is \$10 per night. It is available only for equestrians and through-hikers on the Pacific Crest Trail. Regular public camping is not allowed, since there are two excellent public campgrounds nearby (Baker and Deadman).

This is bear country, so bring bear-resistant containers for human food and horse feed. There is horse water at the equestrian campground, but bring your own potable water.



THEREFORE, BY SIGNING BELOW, I KNOWINGLY ASSUME THE UNAVOIDABLE RISKS INHERENT IN ALL HORSE-RELATED ACTIVITIES, WHETHER KNOWN OR UNKNOWN, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO BODILY INJURY AND PHYSICAL HARM TO HORSE, RIDER AND SPECTATOR, AND AGREE TO THE FOLLOWING ON BEHALF OF MYSELF AND MY SPOUSE, IF ANY:

1. 




