MINUTES LBHA Board and General Meeting September 21, 2016

Meeting was called to order by Maureen at 7:00 pm. The following Board members were present: Maureen Henderson, Patricia Gibbs, Greg King, Bree Hendricks, Janis Rau, and Barbara Lawrie. Committee Chairpersons present were: Liz Daffner and Kathy Dombrowski. Not Present: Dave Faoro, Barbara Heyward and Melanie Warlow.

Tack Swap Report: Liz reviewed Facebook advertising; parking; signs for directing traffic to the swap and directional signs for the parking lot itself; arena v. upper parking lots for vendor spots; and overflow parking in the big arena.

Horse Show Report: Kathy advised we were beginning to receive entries and is planning on taking pre-show signups at the tack swap. Maureen reported she had approached High Hand Nursery for plant donation for the jumps on the day of the English show. There was discussion of where to further distribute horse show flyers. Maureen had been given a flyer for an upcoming Care for Aging Horses upcoming event at Mt. Vernon Equestrian Center. We will send out an email blast to the membership.

Trails Report: Pat reported that the mountain bike community was unhappy with our draft trails policy. She and Maureen met with Matt Weber and Mark Pecotich, representatives of the mountain bike community, for clarification of some issues. There were some misconceptions by the biking community with regard to the biking community having to build its own trails. They discussed trail modifications, with safety being the main concern by LBHA. There was further discussion re multiuse standards and the lack of reporting problems to a central data bank.

Bike/Horse Clinic: Maureen reported on a possible partnership with Victory Velo Bike Shop for the upcoming clinic

Christmas Party: There was discussion on where the Christmas party should be held this year. Member Bree Hendricks offered the Horse-N-Beyond boutique in Newcastle. Discussion ensued whether to have the party at the Round Table located on Elm Avenue in Auburn or the boutique. The date for the party this year will be Wednesday, December 7. Location to be decided at the next meeting.

There was no report on Traylor Ranch as Dave Faoro was absent.

Rescue Horse Issues: Maureen reported on a current animal abuse conflict in which she is involved. Due to incident occurring in Foresthill, no action will be taken by LBHA.

ARENA:: Please NO TRAILERS or HORSES on the asphalt parking lot. ALSO, no barrels, poles or other equipment may be used in the arena. Small Orange cones are OK. Trainers must have an Arena Use form submitted annually as well as the proper insurance naming LBHA and Placer County as "Also Insureds." If Insurance is cancelled 2 times or more, the permit is no longer valid. Trainers MUST contact LBHA with the time and number of students that will be in class, 24 hrs before the lesson. (All Forms are on LBHA Website at LBHA.us)




Na'alapa Stables in Waipio Valley

On the northeast side of the "big island" of Hawaii by Robert H. Sydnor, A.E.R.C. Trail Master October 2016

Introduction

We arrived a week early on the "big island" of Hawaii for a 4-day professional geology convention in Kona (on the "dry" **western** side of the island). So we went to the rainy **eastern** side of the island, checked into a hotel in Hilo, then drove north on Highway 19 to the Waipio Valley and rented horses at the Na'alapa Stables. Shown below is an index map for the horse stables.



Na'alapa Stables in Waipio Valley, telephone 808-775-0419, www.naalapastables.com From Hilo, drive north about 1½ hours on Highway 19, then turn onto Highway 240. Morning or afternoon

2½ hour rides are \$89. Reservations are recommended. Each ride is led by an experienced equestrian. All participants must sign a legal waiver. Groups are limited to 12 riders. Take a van from the office and descend a steep narrow road to the valley floor where the horse stables are located in a lush forest. The pace is at a walk for these steady horses, following dirt roads and trails with shallow creek crossings. These experienced and savvy rental horses have crossed these creeks a thousand times, so there are no predicaments. With an average annual rainfall of 80 to 100-inches, it rains frequently, so check the weather report, and bring a light jacket and a hat.

Waipio Valley receives about **100inches of rain** per year. Centuries ago, this flat-bottomed valley with steep cliffs on each side had a population of over ten thousand native Hawaiians because of fertile soil and high rainfall. There are currently less than 50 people who live and farm here.

There are two high waterfalls: **Kaluahine Falls** (620 feet) and **Hi'ilawe Falls** (1,450 feet, the highest on the island).

The best **reference book** is: Andrew Doughty, 2016, Hawaii, the big island revealed, 8th edition: Wizard Publications, 315 pages in color, with maps and photos, \$19.99 (available from Amazon.com).

The **best map** is: Robert Siemers, 2015, Hawaii Island Atlas and Maps: Environmental Designs, \$6.95, colored map, including a geologic map, rainfall map, and other scientific maps.

Tack Swap

We had our first Tack Swap on September 25th with many volunteers making it a successful and well attended event. Bree Hendricks helped plan the event and I'm grateful for her commercial vendor experience. She's also the reason Maria's Tacos food truck attended. Their burritos and tacos were delicious! Pat Gibbs and Maureen Hendersen welcomed sellers and directed them to the loading zones while Melanie Warlow and her husband Joe helped them park in the arena. We didn't know how many people would attend so we wanted to have enough space around the booths for buyers to park. Now we know parking can be a little looser. Kathy D was awesome as always. She set up the LBHA booth and helped iron out all the little details such as garbage cans, paint for the lines, electrical ETC. She also organized the selling of hats, T shirts, and waters from the LBHA booth. We signed up new members and help spread the word about the upcoming horse Show. Barbara Lawrie and Carol Davis filled the first LBHA booth shift while everything was still being set up. Then my own mommy Alberta Daffner pitched in. Maureen made sure that the vendor area was all clean the night before and brought ice for our bottled waters and balloons for the Tack Swap sign along King Rd. Greg and his girls did a wonderful job helping people unload. They helped with heavy lifting, setting up easy-up, tables, ETC. The buyers really appreciated the extra hands. Our Treasurer Janis Rau collected the booth fee from everyone and was up early posting our signs at every major intersection including both Penryn freeway off ramps. Pete Rau graciously took them all down to finish the day.

We had about 17 sellers, some reserved multiple spaces. Vendors included artists, LBHA members, nonmembers, and even a Sensy Candle vendor. I caught my husband leaving her booth with an including the scent of *leather* for his recently renovated man space. My husband...

Many of the sellers gave positive feedback and almost everyone was surprised with how much they sold. Several vendors gave us valuable input for our next Tack Swap that could be in Spring depending on what our membership decides. In addition to posting flyers around town and advertising through our own membership, we created a facebook ad that reached 11,012 people and was shared 129 times between friends. Not bad for our first attempt at advertising through social media.

Directions:

- Mix together the dry ingredients in a medium bowl.
- Next, add the molasses and applesauce and stir until well-incorporated.
- Once mixed, form the thick batter into teaspoon -sized balls and place them close together (but not touching) on a sprayed* cookie tray.
- Bake the treats for 15 to 20 minutes and then remove from oven.
- Leave the treats on the tray for 5 minutes to allow time for the treats to cool and harden.
- Once completely cool, store the treats in an airtight container.
- *When making treats, spray the cookie trays with coconut oil, a substitute of your choice, or grease the pans with butter.

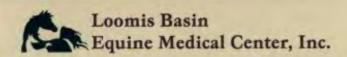

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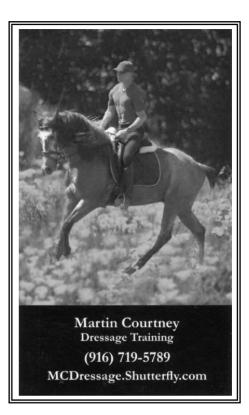
