The meeting was called to order at 6:15 by President Maureen Henderson.

Liz reported on the new LBHA Arena sign. A discussion was held regarding language clarification. She will make suggested changes and report again.

Kathy Dombrowski reported on the recent purchase of LBHA club T Shirts and hats. The articles will be sold at \$12 for visors, \$15 for hats and T Shirts will be \$12-15.

A report was given on the current status of the Officers and Directors Insurance purchased through ACE Insurance Company. The company currently maintains an A++ rating and will cover all litigation against LBHA as long as the Bylaws and Standing Rules are followed.

Reports:

There was no Treasurers report

A discussion was held regarding a proposed Horse Show Prep Clinic. It was decided to ask local trainers to offer assistance and expertise to clinic participants. The clinic is planned for September 20, 2015 from 9:30-11:30 at the LBHA arena.

Kathy Dombrowski gave an LBHA membership update. Currently we have 168 members. The membership roster will be mailed out soon. A motion was made by Liz, and seconded by Dave, to post on line reminders to members who need to renew their expired memberships. There were 6 approved votes and 1 nay. The motion was passed.

Kathy gave an update on the upcoming LBHA Horse Show sponsorships. Members were encouraged to continue to seek out additional sponsors. In addition, it was announced that classes for the October 10, 11, 2015 LBHA Horse Show will be posted on line. There will be a few changes made in the classes that are offered.

Pat reported on the Bicycle Pump Park and Bickford Ranch Trails. She stated that the ARD will be holding a meeting on Aug. 27, 2015 to continue the discussion of the Bike Pump Park. The current position of LBHA is to encourage a trail which is not impacted by the park and is only a hike/equestrian trail, not multi-use. Bickford is likely to be on the September Horseshoe Bar/Penryn MAC agenda.

Pat reported that the LBHA mission Statement is a "work in progress."

Dave Faoro stated that the Traylor Ranch work days for August and September will probably be canceled.

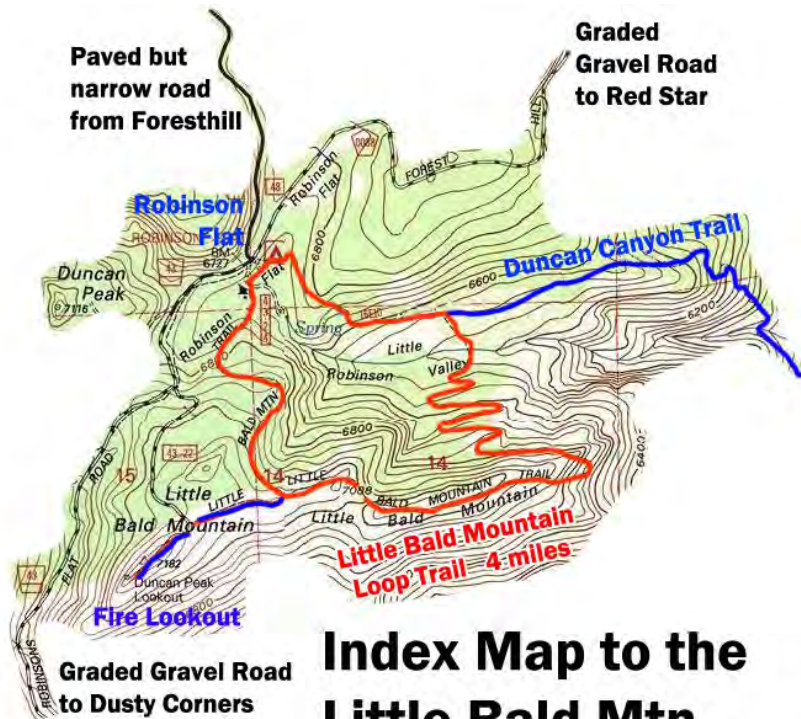

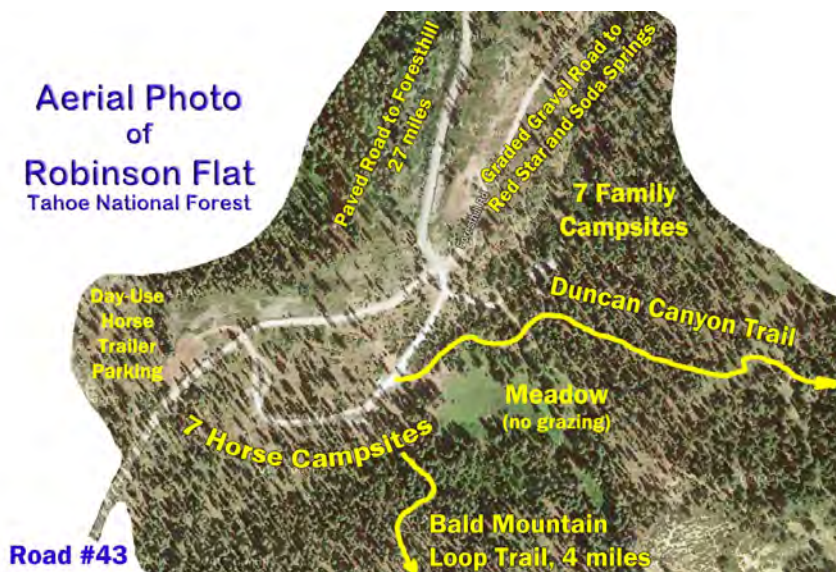


Little Bald Mountain Loop

Robinson Flat, Foresthill Road,
American River Ranger District, Tahoe National Forest

Introduction

This trail is located east of Foresthill, and the equestrian staging area is at **Robinson Flat**.

The **Little Bald Mountain Loop Trail** is 4 miles long, with several sections where the trail is on the brink of a steep cliff in rock. It is best to ride this loop counter-clockwise, so that horses will ascend on a trail-bed that is earthen, and descend on rock with no soil.

There are two timber bridges of modern construction on the Little Bald Mountain Trail where it crosses Robinson Creek that flows into Duncan Canyon.

The **Little Bald Mountain Loop Trail** connects into the steeply descending **Duncan Canyon Trail**. A short spur trail leads to the Duncan Peak Fire Lookout that is operated by Tahoe National Forest in the summertime when forest-fires are quite possible.

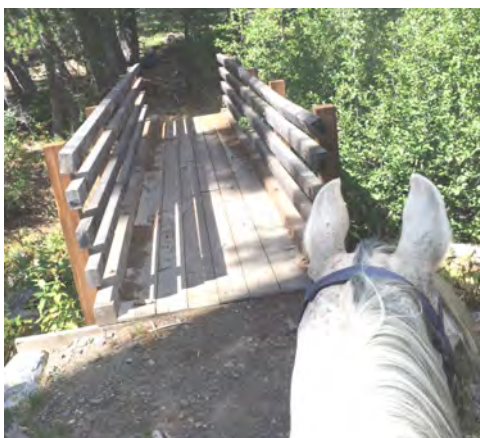

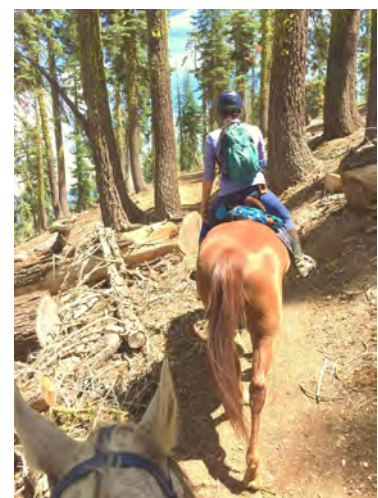

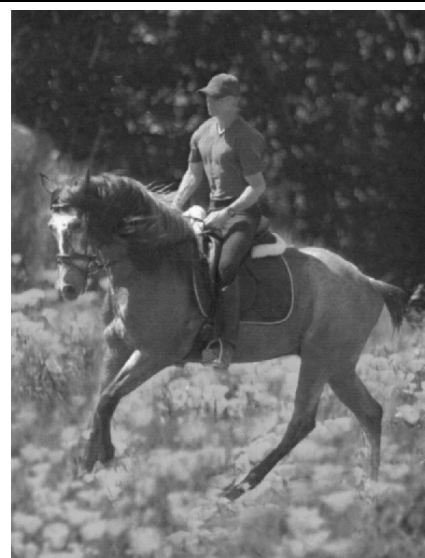

RELEASE AND HOLD HARMLESS AGREEMENT

The Undersigned assumes the unavoidable risks inherent in all horse-related activities, including but not limited to bodily injury and physical harm to horse, rider and spectator. The Undersigned acknowledges that horse-related activities are dangerous and that horses themselves have unpredictable temperaments which can sometimes cause injury. The Undersigned acknowledges that even the most experienced horse event sponsor, participant or horse owner cannot predict how each individual horse will react in a variety of situations and cannot guarantee my safety. THEREFORE, BY SIGNING BELOW, I KNOWINGLY ASSUME THE UNAVOIDABLE RISKS INHERENT IN ALL HORSE-RELATED ACTIVITIES, WHETHER KNOWN OR UNKNOWN, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO BODILY INJURY AND PHYSICAL HARM TO HORSE, RIDER AND SPECTATOR, AND AGREE TO THE FOLLOWING ON BEHALF OF MYSELF AND MY SPOUSE, IF ANY:

1. I HEREBY RELEASE AND DISCHARGE LOOMIS BASIN HORSEMEN'S ASSOCIATION ("LBHA"), THE LBHA BOARD OF DIRECTORS, ALL LBHA OFFICERS AND INDIVIDUAL CLUB MEMBERS AND THEIR AGENTS, EMPLOYEES, OR REPRESENTATIVES, AS WELL AS PLACER COUNTY, (HEREINAFTER COLLECTIVELY KNOWN AS "RELEASEES") FROM ALL ACTIONS, CLAIMS OR DEMANDS I MAY NOW OR HEREAFTER HAVE FROM INJURY, DEATH OR DAMAGE RESULTING FROM MY PARTICIPATION IN ANY HORSE-RELATED ACTIVITIES SPONSORED BY LBHA, AT LOOMIS BASIN HORSEMEN'S ARENA OR AT ANY OTHER LOCATION.

2. I also EXPRESSLY WAIVE any rights I may have under California Civil Code §1542, which states: "A general release does not extend to claims which the creditor does not know or suspect to exist in his favor at the time of executing the release, which if known by him must have materially affected his settlement with the debtor."

5. I agree that I will DEFEND, INDEMNIFY AND HOLD HARMLESS Releasees against all claims, demands, and causes of action, including court costs and actual attorney's fees, arising from any proceeding or lawsuit brought against them due to any act done by me, or brought by me or for my benefit.
