MINUTES LBHA Board and General Meeting September 20, 2017

Meeting was called to order by Maureen at 6:40 pm. The following Board members were present: Maureen Henderson, Janis Rau, Barbara Heyward, Flo Faoro, Dave Faoro, Melanie Warlow. Not Present: Kathy Dombrowski, Sherry Debaere, and Greg King.

Janis Rau gave the Treasurer's Report. She asked Dave F. for receipts on Traylor Ranch.

Dave reported on the new P.A. system he purchased for arena: He will set up both the old speaker system and the proposed new equipment on Saturday morning at 9:00 a.m. LBHA members present will evaluate and determine which system best meets our needs. The new system can be returned within 30 days.

Auburn Bike Park: Due to the number of comments submitted on the Draft CEQA Report, the hearing scheduled to be held last week was continued until September 28 at 6:00 p.m. at the Maidu Community Center. Pat Gibbs will attend on behalf of LBHA. The ARD has scheduled a site walk for Thursday evening. Maureen, Janis and Pat Gibbs are planning to attend. Items to monitor: chain link fence and clear signage excluding bikes from the designated horse/hiker trail.

Arena upgrades:Liz Daffner sent a report on upper arena sand upgrade: Livingston'sgave us an estimate of \$4,744 with a \$500 donation if they can hang an advertising banner. Taking down and redoing the fencing is not included. Jennifer will contact John Foerstal to find out if he is interested in providing us with an estimate. Dave moved that we get a total of 3 bids for the work to be done. Maureen seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously. We will ask Liz to contact Robinson's Sand and Gravel for the third bid.

Traylor Ranch: Dave Faoro reported that no more work days will be necessary through the end of the year.

Parking for the horse show--details to be decided soon.

The December LBHA holiday meeting is booked at Round Table in Auburn from 6-9 p.m., Wednesday, December 20th.

The next meeting will be held on Wednesday, October 18, 2017 at Round Table in Loomis. Eat at 6:00 pm, meeting at 6:30 pm.

The meeting adjourned at 7:30 pm.

ARENA:: Please NO TRAILERS or HORSES on the asphalt parking lot. ALSO, no barrels, poles or other equipment may be used in the arena. Small Orange cones are OK. Trainers must have an Arena Use form submitted annually as well as the proper insurance naming LBHA and Placer County as "Also Insureds." If Insurance is cancelled 2 times or more, the permit is no longer valid. Trainers MUST contact LBHA with the time and number of students that will be in class, 24 hrs before the lesson. (All Forms are on LBHA Website at LBHA.us)

Pride is no longer doing maintenance, now have a new company that knows what to do. A new sign up has gone up on the trail for Trail Right of Way. Horses have the right of way. The swing over the creek is gone. The pile of red dirt in the gravel parking lot before the red gate was dumped with out permission. As soon as Roads can get to it they will remove it. 

Mule Rides in Grand Canyon National Park

both the South Rim and the North Rim

Mule rides into the Grand Canyon have been popular since the Bright Angel Trail opened to tourists in 1891. More than 600,000 people have ridden mules in the Grand Canyon in the past century. The mules are sturdy, calm, and in excellent physical shape. Mule rides led by an experienced wrangler are available for hire in Grand Canyon National Park for both the South Rim and the North Rim. It is best to reserve a ride one year in advance, since these mule rides are very popular. The equestrian concessionaires are different for the South Rim and the North Rim, as described on page 2. You are welcome to bring your own helmet.

Canyon Vistas Trail Ride

4-miles and 3-hours duration, in groups of 20 riders, \$142.83 per rider (must be over 9 years old and weigh less than 220 pounds)

Overnight Ride to Phantom Ranch at Colorado River

This is a steep $10\frac{1}{2}$ -mile descent in $5\frac{1}{2}$ hours on the Bright Angel Trail to the bottom of the Grand Canyon, then across the river on the suspension bridge. Overnight bunks with meals at the Phantom Ranch. Bring your own duffel bag with overnight supplies. Cost is \$588.43 per person. Weight limit is 200 pounds, fully dressed. See the Xantera website for complete details.

North Rim *(fewer crowds of people because of remote access via Utah; closed in winter)* Canyon Trail Rides, Post Office Box 128, Tropic, Utah 84776

This equestrian concessionaire has about 200 horses and mules for three national parks: Zion National Park, Bryce Canyon National Park, and the North Rim of the Grand Canyon National Park. They are based out of Utah.

- **1-hour trip** of the rim of the Grand Canyon = \$45 per person, 7 year age limit, 220 pound weight limit; rides at 9:30 AM and 1:30 PM
- **3-hour trip** of the inner canyon (to the Supai Tunnel) = \$90 per person, 10 year age limit, 200 pound weight limit; rides at 7:30 AM and 12:30 PM



The Undersigned acknowledges that horse-related activities are dangerous and that horses themselves have unpredictable temperaments which can sometimes cause injury. The Undersigned acknowledges that even the most experienced horse event sponsor, participant or horse owner cannot predict how each individual horse will react in a variety of situations and cannot guarantee my safety. THEREFORE, BY SIGNING BELOW, I KNOWINGLY ASSUME THE UNAVOIDABLE RISKS INHERENT IN ALL HORSE-RELATED ACTIVITIES, WHETHER KNOWN OR UNKNOWN, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO BODILY INJURY AND PHYSICAL HARM TO HORSE, RIDER AND SPECTATOR, AND AGREE TO THE FOLLOWING ON BEHALF OF MYSELF AND MY SPOUSE, IF ANY:

1. IHEREBY RELEASE AND DISCHARGE LOOMIS BASIN HORSE-MEN'S ASSOCIATION ("LBHA"), THE LBHA BOARD OF DIRECTORS, ALL LBHA OFFICERS AND INDIVIDUAL CLUB MEMBERS AND THEIR AGENTS, EMPLOYEES, OR REPRESENTATIVES, AS WELL AS PLACER COUNTY, (HEREINAFTER COLLECTIVELY KNOWN AS "RELEASEES") FROM ALL ACTIONS, CLAIMS OR DEMANDS I MAY NOW OR HEREAFTER HAVE FROM INJURY, DEATH OR DAMAGE RESULTING FROM MY PARTICIPATION IN ANY HORSE-RELATED ACTIVITIES SPONSORED BY LBHA, AT LOOMIS BASIN HORSEMEN'S ARENA OR AT ANY OTHER LOCATION.
