Board Meeting Minutes April 6, 2016

Meeting was called to order by Maureen at 6:00 pm. The following Board members were present: Maureen Henderson, Pat Gibbs, Greg King, Barbara Lawrie, Barbara Heyward, Dave Faoro, Janis Rau, Melanie Warlow. Committee Chairpersons present were: Liz Daffner. Not Present: Bree Hendricks.

Guest speaker, Deanna Marsh, gave a presentation on behalf of PARC (Protect American River Canyons). The presentation focused on the construction of a multi-use trail bridge spanning the North Fork of the American River at China Bar to connect Auburn to Cool. The presentation was an abbreviated version. A full presentation is scheduled to be made at the Canyon View Community Center on Monday, April 11 from 7:00 to 9:00 pm. PARC has prepared post cards addressed to Jason DeWall of the CA Dept. of Parks and Recreation and Drew Lessard, U.S. Bureau of Reclamation. These cards are being distributed to individuals to sign and mail in support of the bridge construction. Everyone present at the meeting signed the cards.

Pat Gibbs motioned that we contact FATRAC (Folsom Auburn Trail Riders Action Coalition) to write a joint letter to Jason DeWall and Drew Lessard in support of the China Bridge project. If FATRAC declines to participate in joint letter, LBHA will send one of our own. The motion was 2nded by Janis Rau. The motion was discussed, voted upon and unanimously approved. Pat will contact a representative of FATRAC.

Pat Gibbs Trail Report: Pat announced that Grant funding for the Georgetown RD Non-Motorized Trail Maintenance Project was approved to receive full funding. LBHA had previously written a letter in support of that grant. She is scheduled to have a meeting with Parks to discuss safe trails on the Western States Pioneer Express National Recreation Trail in the next few weeks.

Janis Rau Treasurer Report: Janis gave a treasurer's report for the first quarter, ending March 31. There were some questions as to when the LBHA Certificate of Deposit is scheduled to renew. Janis will check on that and get back to the Board.

Dave Faoro Traylor Ranch Report: Dave advised that the Audubon Society has expressed a desire to become more involved with Traylor Ranch. The Society is redesigning the kiosk at the Humphrey Road entrance. Plans have been submitted to the County and are awaiting approval. There is also a new proposed map design for both entrances to the Ranch.

LBHA received a request for donations from ACE (Action Coalition for Equestrians). Pat made a motion that LBHA donate \$100 to the Auburn Fairgrounds Barn Renovation Project and \$100 to the Sterling Point Equestrian Staging Area Fund. The motion was seconded by Barbara Heyward, discussed, voted upon and unanimously approved.

LBHA had received an invitation to join from the Loomis Basin Chamber of Commerce. Barbara Lawrie made a motion that we **not** join the Loomis Basin Chamber of Commerce. The motion was seconded by Pat Gibbs, discussed, voted upon and unanimously approved.

Horse Expo: Dave made a motion that LBHA **not** attend Horse Expo. The motion was seconded by Greg King, discussed, voted upon and unanimously approved.

Helmet Rule: Pat Gibbs made a motion that LBHA require all riders under 18 to wear helmets for all events and horse shows. The motion was seconded by Barbara Heyward. Discussion was held, including the question of whether or not LBHA should purchase some helmets for individuals to wear in the event they attend an event and do not have a helmet. Barbara Heyward will ask her husband to look into the legal and liability issues which may be of concern with regard to providing helmets. Voting was held and the motion was unanimously passed. The question of purchasing helmets was tabled until the Board receives a response from Barbara on legal/liability issues.

Membership: The membership chairperson had provided a list of members who had not renewed. Discussion was held about how to simplify membership. Thereafter, a motion was made by Janis Rau that we extend the memberships of those whose memberships expire in June to December 31, 2016. The motion was seconded by Barbara Lawrie. After discussion, a vote was held and the motion was unanimously approved. We will send out an email to the membership that all renewals will now occur in January of each year.

The meeting adjourned at 8:05 pm.

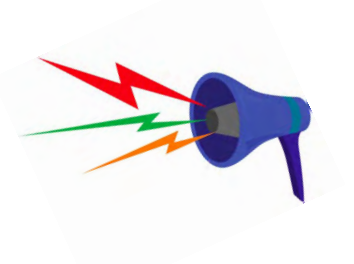

The Wild Turkey Trail connects to a dozen other short looping trails within Traylor Ranch. There is an outhouse and horse water-trough located at the north-central area (near the manager's residence along English Colony Road). No dogs are allowed because Traylor Ranch is a bird sanctuary. In season, you can pick blackberries at Traylor Ranch. Equestrians are welcome to bring birdseed for the bird-feeders.

Introduction and Location

The Wild Turkey Trail is 0.7-miles long, and is located in the northeastern corner of Traylor Ranch near the intersection of English Colony Road and Humphrey Road in Penryn. Use the Humphrey Road parking lot for your horse trailer. For information, visit the website of Placer County Parks at

ENJOYING AN AFTERNOON RIDE ON THE TRAIL

I resided in Anchorage, Alaska for almost 10 years. I was fortunate to have acreage and this is where I first owned a horse of my own and I could keep her at home. I can tell you, it's quite a place to "start" with horses. I lived in the hillside area very close to the Chugach National Park, where I could ride right from my home. Being very independent, I have always ridden quite a bit by myself, because you know, I couldn't always wait for a riding buddy; otherwise, I might not get to ride very much. Well, one day I was out riding my beautiful gray mare on a nice leisurely trail ride. We were on our way home, going through an area I had never ridden before, when all of a sudden I found myself sitting on my horse with my feet on the ground. My horse and I had fallen into a sink hole. It was rather wet and squishy and I wasn't sure what to do. If I got off, was I going to sink into this hole? My wonderful mare was equally surprised and just stood there in mud up to her belly. Seeing as I didn't really have much of a choice, I was decided to get off (quite a feeling when your feet are already on the ground), and luckily, I guess since I didn't weigh too much, I didn't sink into the black hole. I was able to make it to solid ground, took the reins with me and coaxed my mare to follow me. We had been together for many years by then and had quite a bond. With her trust in me, she began to try to push herself up and out as I was coaxing her. Because it was summer and I had been showing hunter/jumper, she was very strong in hind end and enough power to thrust herself out of the hole onto solid ground. The only injury she received was a scrape on the inside of her rear leg where one shoe had scraped off the skin as she was attempting to get enough momentum to push herself up. Luckily, we weren't far from home and were able to walk back on our own. After a quick hosing down of her legs, I found the injuries were minimal. We were lucky that day. Needless to say, I never took that trail again.

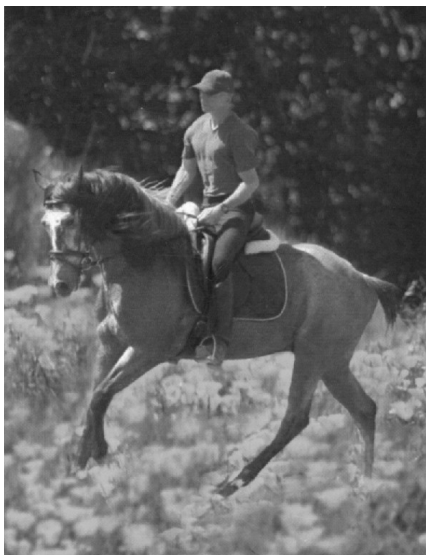

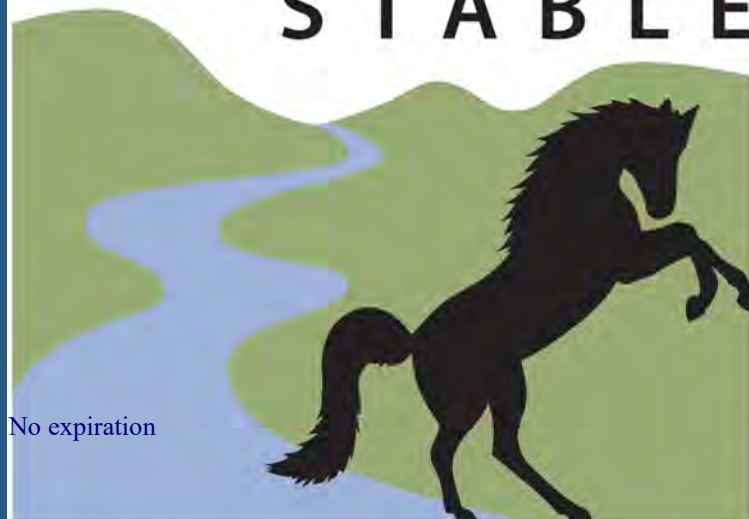

RELEASE AND HOLD HARMLESS AGREEMENT

The Undersigned assumes the unavoidable risks inherent in all horse-related activities, including but not limited to bodily injury and physical harm to horse, rider and spectator. The Undersigned acknowledges that horse-related activities are dangerous and that horses themselves have unpredictable temperaments which can sometimes cause injury. The Undersigned acknowledges that even the most experienced horse event sponsor, participant or horse owner cannot predict how each individual horse will react in a variety of situations and cannot guarantee my safety. THEREFORE, BY SIGNING BELOW, I KNOWINGLY ASSUME THE UNAVOIDABLE RISKS INHERENT IN ALL HORSE-RELATED ACTIVITIES, WHETHER KNOWN OR UNKNOWN, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO BODILY INJURY AND PHYSICAL HARM TO HORSE, RIDER AND SPECTATOR, AND AGREE TO THE FOLLOWING ON BEHALF OF MYSELF AND MY SPOUSE, IF ANY:

1. I HEREBY RELEASE AND DISCHARGE LOOMIS BASIN HORSEMEN'S ASSOCIATION ("LBHA"), THE LBHA BOARD OF DIRECTORS, ALL LBHA OFFICERS AND INDIVIDUAL CLUB MEMBERS AND THEIR AGENTS, EMPLOYEES, OR REPRESENTATIVES, AS WELL AS PLACER COUNTY, (HEREINAFTER COLLECTIVELY KNOWN AS "RELEASEES") FROM ALL ACTIONS, CLAIMS OR DEMANDS I MAY NOW OR HEREAFTER HAVE FROM INJURY, DEATH OR DAMAGE RESULTING FROM MY PARTICIPATION IN ANY HORSE-RELATED ACTIVITIES SPONSORED BY LBHA, AT LOOMIS BASIN HORSEMEN'S ARENA OR AT ANY OTHER LOCATION.

2. I also EXPRESSLY WAIVE any rights I may have under California Civil Code §1542, which states: "A general release does not extend to claims which the creditor does not know or suspect to exist in his favor at the time of executing the release, which if known by him must have materially affected his settlement with the debtor."

5. I agree that I will DEFEND, INDEMNIFY AND HOLD HARMLESS Releasees against all claims, demands, and causes of action, including court costs and actual attorney's fees, arising from any proceeding or lawsuit brought against them due to any act done by me, or brought by me or for my benefit.

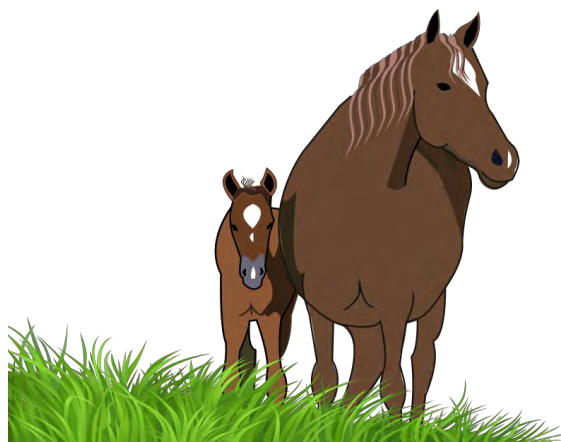
