MINUTES LBHA Board Meeting September 4, 2019

The Board held a meeting at Gander Tap House located on Taylor Road, Loomis, CA. The following Board members were present: Liz Daffner, Maureen Henderson, Greg King, Bruce Renfrow, Janis Rau, Denise Howell, and Kathy Dombrowski. Kate Johnson and Joe Warlow were unable to be present.

President Liz Daffner called the meeting to order at 6:10 p.m.

The main focus of the meeting was to finalize planning of the upcoming horse shows on Oct. 12 and 13, 2019. The draft class list was reviewed, and suggestions were made for minor corrections to formatting and the additions of classes. No additional classes were added to the English Day. On Western day, we decided to delete the Costume Class (No. W11) and add a class between Nos. 37 and 38, entitled Trail Walk/ Jog – 18 & Over.

For English Day, Janis will check on the spoons for the egg and spoon class.

Denise made a motion to pay the trail judge \$150.00, an increase from \$75.00 last year. The motion was seconded by Liz, voted upon and passed unanimously. Denise will also contact Lisa Bradley to confirm the new hours (9-2) are agreeable to her. We need to obtain a scribe for Lisa Bradley to assist with the trail class. Maureen will add this position to the Volunteer Sign-Up program.

Kathy will contact Terry Haney re the trail trials. Kathy will also be responsible for the printing of the class list which will have a light blue cover this year.

The next agenda item was a review of the revised Horse Show Entry Form. There was a suggestion that a couple of boxes be added to the phone number line to indicate whether a phone is a cell or home number. No other changes were suggested so the form is accepted as revised.

Janis volunteered to be responsible for the Porta Potty during the show. She will also confirm with our food vendors for the days of the shows.

Liz volunteered to be responsible for the Western Day Trail Patterns. Due to the weight of the bridge, it was decided that we will not use the bridge this year. Construction of a new trail bridge will be placed on the agenda for discussion in 2020.

Denise volunteered to be responsible for the Ranch Riding pattern – with no poles. Denise also volunteered to be responsible for putting together packets for the judges and will get the appropriate documents to Janis for final inclusion in the Judges' Packets. The Judges Packets will include checks for the judges.

Maureen made a motion that Denise purchase 45 prizes at a cost of \$2.00 or less to be distributed to first place winners of the horse shows. Bruce seconded the motion. After discussion duly held, the motion was unanimously passed.

Janis volunteered to sponsor the Lead Line Class and Denise will purchase a dozen small prizes for the contestants. Janis will prepare the bags for the Lead Line Class.

(Board Meeting Minutes Continued:)

Greg volunteered to be responsible to drag the arena on Friday night prior to the show and also to take care of handing out prizes to first place winners.

Maureen will ask Dave Faoro if he will set up the sound system for the horse shows. She will also contact Debbie Murphy to sign her up for the position she usually fills as a volunteer. Maureen will also contact Donna Kelly to see if she will run the computer on English Day. Maureen will contact Craig Lyman of Douglas Ranch Supply for 2 sets of numbers for the horse shows.

Kathy made a motion that we purchase two sets of walkie talkies for use during the horse shows. The motion was seconded by Liz and passed unanimously by the Board. Greg volunteered to make the actual purchase.

Janis has caution tape which we will be able to use at the shows to mark off the trail course and other areas as necessary.

Discussion was held re dragging the baseball field at the end of the show. Bruce will check on being able to obtain a chain link drag. Greg will have a tractor there.

The meeting adjourned at 7:45 p.m. The general membership meeting will be held on Wednesday, September 18, 2019 at Round Table Pizza in Loomis.

Liz called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

Maureen gave a brief report on the Hidden Falls Expansion. She gave an additional report on ebikes, informing the membership that Tahoe National Forest has unilaterally decided that Class 1 e-bikes are legal on non-motorized trails. Liz made a motion, seconded by Kathy, that Maureen write a letter to the Tahoe National Forest expressing our concerns about the recent decision. The motion was presented for a vote. The membership voted unanimously in favor of the motion.

The last segment of the trails report focused on the recently released ASRA trail plan. FATRAC (Folsom Auburn Trail Riders Action Coalition – mountain bikes) is asking ASRA for access to both the Pioneer Trail and the Western States Trail. Due to the comment period closing, Maureen wrote to ASRA Public Comments opposing the opening of these trails to mountain bikes.

The next agenda item was discussion about the upcoming horse shows. The class list was reviewed and some suggestions were made. Discussion was held about how to bring in more competitors. How to get more sponsors. Some potential sponsor names were mentioned and several of our board members will make contact. The volunteer list was reviewed and several members signed up


Laurene briefly discussed the upcoming obstacle clinic, requesting help setting up. Maureen offered to help. There are usually enough people at the end to help put the items away.

All Memberships NOW renew every January 1 so those of you that have memberships that expire in June have an extension to December 31st. Pay on line the easy way!





Cure Your Horse-Show Jitters Horse and Rider.com

A pre-show ritual can do more than just cure your horse-show jitters; this one enables you to be focused, energized, and eager to perform.

Do you get nervous before competing at an event? Most people do. Fortunately, there's a way not only to calm your horse-show jitters, but also to prepare you to perform your very best.

To give that blue-ribbon effort, you must call up a state of mind, body, and emotion that enables you to be calm, focused, and confident. And energized! This means you're eager to perform, with just the right amount of muscle tension to be ready but not tense, and able to access the skills you've worked so hard to achieve. In other words, you must be in the zone. What puts you there? A mental ritual you've practiced in advance until it's second nature. Then, when you do it right before your class, you feel that calm, clear, let's-go feeling settle over you.

How It Works

Your pre-show ritual will consist of an anchoring phrase, correct breathing for relaxation, a confident posture, and a visualization of success. You'll link all these together by frequent practice beforehand at home and at your barn.

Then, no matter how frazzled you're feeling before your class, performing the ritual will trigger the calm and confidence you've conditioned into it. You'll be able to focus at the start of your ride, plus have a way to keep yourself grounded throughout it.

How to Do It

First, choose a catchphrase that both coaches and encourages you. It must prepare you for those first daunting moments when you walk into the competitive arena. For example, I might say: "OK, Barb, stay cool everything's good. Breathe! You can do this! Chin up, shoulders back, let's go!"

Next, link this catchphrase to a confident posture, a feeling of poised relaxation, and a visualization of you and your horse performing at your best. Start at home, in a chair. Sit as you would in the saddle, with your upper body erect, your shoulders back, your chin up. Close your eyes and take three deep breaths, exhaling each time longer than the inhale. Say your catchphrase to yourself and visualize yourself at the in gate, about to enter a class. Feel yourself confident, relaxed, yet energized, eager to perform. Then visualize the beginning of your ride going smoothly, perfectly.

Practice your catchphrase ritual often—sitting in a chair at home or at the barn.

Keep Practicing

Repeat this process often, throughout the day at home, at work, or at the barn. This part is critical, because without enough practice over time, your ritual won't become internalized.

So rehearse it on work breaks and at lunchtime, plus while riding the bus or riding your horse. Set up a realworld scenario by pausing at the gate before entering your arena at home or at your trainer's. Pretend you're about to enter a class and practice your ritual before riding in.

Eventually, whenever you pull your shoulders back, breathe deeply, and think of your catchphrase, you'll automatically begin to feel confident and relaxed-yet-energized.

The Payoff

On show day, use your ritual the morning of, then as you prepare for your class, and finally at the in gate, before each class. Then, as you ride your pattern, course, or class, bring yourself back to focused confidence whenever necessary by squaring your shoulders, inhaling deeply, and using your catchphrase.

It sounds too good to be true, but it actually isn't—if you practice it diligently enough. Do so, and your ritual will work like a charm when you need it most.





Trainers must have an Arena Use form submitted annually as well as the proper insurance naming LBHA and Placer County as "Also Insureds." If Insurance is cancelled 2 times or more, the permit is no longer valid. Trainers MUST contact LBHA with the time and number of students that will be in class, 24 hrs before the lesson.
